Single non-emergency 101 police number launch announced by the Home Office.

On Wednesday 11 January, the Home Office announced the launch of the national single police non-emergency number, 101. The 101 number was introduced for the whole of South Yorkshire on 4 November and during December 43% of the Force's non-emergency calls were received on the new 101 number.

One reason for introducing a single non-emergency number is to reduce the burden on the 999 service. Approximately two thirds of the 999 calls received by South Yorkshire Police are not genuine emergencies. Recent inappropriate calls have been to report cold kebabs, a lost kitten and a broken video recorder!

Commander Ian Dyson, ACPO lead on contact management, said "Having just two phone numbers - 101 for reporting a crime that has happened, to get advice or to raise local policing issues - or 999 if it's an emergency, makes calling the police a lot easier and makes our services more accessible"

The new 101 number is designed to give the public a memorable number for their local police force to report crimes and concerns that do not require emergency response.

Nick Herbert, Minister for Policing and Criminal Justice, said "The introduction of the 101 number marks one of the most significant changes in the way people contact the police since the 999 number was introduced nearly 70 years ago' the public now have an easier way to contact their local police force with a memorable number for non-emergencies"

The Emergency Social Services Team (ESST) provides out of hours cover for all social care emergencies within Doncaster Metropolitan Borough.

The team is made up of a variety of specialist social care staff so that the relevant staff can be called upon depending on the nature of an enquiry.

Hours of availability

Red Cross Equipment Loans

The Red Cross operates a short-term loan service for wheelchairs and commodes. The maximum period of loan is up to six weeks. This is a donation-funded service. There is no hire charge

We can supply wheelchairs suitable for children of all ages or for adults weighing up to 25 stone. Elevated leg rests can be fitted if required.

In most cases the client, or their representative, will arrange to collect the equipment from the local depot. However, delivery to the client's home can be arranged for a small fee.

Affordable Self-Drive Vehicle Hire from DIAL Doncaster

DIAL Doncaster has a 5 seater vehicle, a Peugeot Expert Tepee Comfort 'Independence' for hire. The vehicle has been adapted to carry a wheelchair user passenger (if you require this additional option). There is a wheelchair ramp fitted for easy access and fold down seats for extra storage, if required. The hire periods can range from a single day to 7 days. The vehicle is ideal for short term and medium hire. The vehicle can be collected from our office based at Shaw Wood Business Park. Hire Charges are: First Day: £35, Additional Days: £30. This vehicle was funded by the Aiming High Project, DMBC.

From the St Ledger (racecourse) roundabout exit onto Bawtry Rd (A638). Stay on Bawtry Rd (A638) until you pass the Punches Hotel, at these traffic light turn left into Church Lane. When you come to a staggered junction, continue ahead on Church Lane, we are on the right.
