CARERS WEEK OPEN DAY

Carers Week saw the official opening of The Carers House the new premises of Doncaster Partnership for Carers Ltd (DPfC). We relocated at the beginning of May and it took a lot of hard work to get it ready for visitors on the 20th June, which was the official open day.

The day went well with lots of people coming throughout the day to see where we had moved to and what new services we were providing. The Open Day was used as a platform to advertise DPfC's new Befriending and Advocacy services as well as the BME Carers Social Club and Open House sessions, to carers, voluntary groups and organisations. We had lots of interest in the new services both from potential users and volunteers.

We had lots of activities taking place at different times of the day with the Carers Quiz proving popular with everyone. Taster Arts and Crafts session took place in the afternoon where people were encouraged to have a go as well as sign up to future sessions.

The 'Day in the life of a Carer' diary board raised lots of interest, with comments such as 'How does he manage to fit all that in one day' from a service provider after reading the day diary of a local working carer.
